

## PHILIP B. SMITH & MANFRED MAX-NEEF



Philip Bartlett Smith (1923–2005) was a Dutch–American experimental physicist who after his retirement devoted himself to studying economics and economic theories. He was an active participant for almost 35 years in the International Pugwash Conferences on Science and World Affairs. Together with one of his colleagues he set up a Dutch Pugwash group and was during many years the moving force behind it.

He was co–author with S.E. Okoya, J. de Wilde and P. Deshingkar of *The World at the Crossroads. Towards a sustainable, equitable and livable world. A Report to the Pugwash Council* (Earthscan 1994).



Manfred Max–Neef is a Chilean–German economist and environmentalist. He is Professor of Ecological Economics in the Southern University of Chile, and Director of the Economics Institute. He is an honorary member of the Club of Rome and member of the European Academy of Sciences and Arts, the Leopold Kohr Academy of Salzburg, Austria, and the New York Academy of Sciences.

He is the author of *From the Outside Looking In: Experiences in Barefoot Economics*, and his book *Human Scale Development* has been recognized by Cambridge University as one of the fifty most important texts in Sustainability.

He received the Alternative Nobel Prize (Right Livelihood Award) in 1983.
